#### **Questionnaire information**



- 80 organizations from 4 countries Czech Republic, Germany, Italy, Lithuania answered the questions.
- Organizations were sent an online questionnaire with 23 questions on
  - the focus of their activities,
  - their organization's barrier, specifying what the barriers are,
  - volunteering in the form of a form, number of volunteers in organizations,
  - the existence of volunteers with any kind of disadvantage, handicaps,
  - activities for volunteers with disability or mental issues,
  - experience of cooperation between an experienced volunteer and a volunteer with a disability, and so on.











## Area of focus of the organization




80 organizations from 4 countries completed the question.

Each nonprofit could write an area in which the organization feels it works.

Some NGOs filled only one area.

Some NGOs have filled multiple areas. The graph shows which areas were filled in most often.














# Are the organizations barrier-free?



80 organizations from 4 countries completed the question.

Organizations responded to the question whether is the infrastructure of our organization barrier free, meaning accessible for people with physical disabilities.














## What kinds of barriers do you have?



40 NGOs are fully barrier-free. (A total of 80 organizations were interviewed.)

The remaining NGOs have at least a small barrier.

The most frequently barriers named shows the chart.













#### International volunteers




60 organizations from the Czech Republic, Germany and Lithuania replied to the question whether organizations send or receive international volunteers.

66.7% of NGOs are hosting or sending international volunteer.

26.7% of NGOs do not accept or send international volunteers.

We do not have information from NGOs from Italy.














### Number of volunteers in the NGOs

80 organizations answered the question *How many volunteers in total do you have within your organization?* 

63 out of 80 NGOs (78.8%) have at least one volunteer.

The most common number of volunteers in an NGOs is 1 to 9 volunteers (25 out of 80 NGOs).













## Number of volunteers with a disability



66 NGOs with volunteers answered the question How many of them have a mental or physical disability or a mental health issue?

16 out of 66 (24,2%) have no such volunteer.

15 of them (22,7%) did not want or could not answer the question.
Organizations do not ask volunteers about their health.














### **Inclusive volunteer client of the NGOs**

These organizations described how they recruited these volunteers.














#### Kind of volunteer work

These organizations described What kind of volunteer work they do?














## Do you have coordinator of volunteers?



66 NGOs with volunteers answered the question *Do you have coordinator of volunteers?* 

More than half of the NGOs (51.5%) said they had a volunteer coordinator.














## **Methodology for involving volunteers**



All 80 NGOs answered the question **Do you** have a methodology for involving volunteers with disabilities?

Yes answered only 5 NGOs (6,3 % of respondense).














## An experienced and a inclusive volunteer



All 80 NGOs answered the question *Do you have experience of cooperation between an experienced volunteer and a volunteer with a disability?* 

Yes answered only 10 organizations (12,5 % of respondense).














#### **Volunteers with disabilities**



All 80 NGOs answered the question *Are you* willing to accept/welcome people with disabilities or mental issues as volunteers?

Yes answered 53 organizations (66,3 % of respondense).

No answered only 6 organizations (7,5% of respondense).

So that none of them are forgotten. The answers are authentic according to the testimonies of the organizations. Sometimes it would say 'I don't know'.




#### Kind of volunteers commitment

Most organizations prefer occasional attendance. That's 46 out of 80 (57,5 % of respondense).














## Involvement of people with disabilities



All 80 NGOs answered the question *Are you interested in a personal / online meeting on the issue of involving people with disabilities in volunteering?* 

The issue of involving people with disabilities in volunteer work interests more than half of people, specifically 60 out of 80. That's 75 % of respondents.














## Being a part of the information group



All 80 NGOs answered the question *Do you* want to be part of an information group interested in involving people with disabilities in volunteering?

Most organizations (52 out of 80, that's 65%) are interested in being part of an information group.














## Share example of good practice
